- Interpretation: The insights gained through inquiry enhance the seeker's capacity to comprehend and internalize concepts. Mental refinement leads to sharper discernment and a growing understanding of nonduality.
- **Reflection**: This is the stage of intellectual absorption, where the seeker builds a conceptual framework. It feels like progress, but there remains an inherent limitation: concepts are only pointers, not the Truth itself.
- **Nondual Insight**: The attempt to "retain" understanding is a subtle act of grasping by the ego. The seeker must eventually see that comprehension and retention are tools that cannot contain the infinite. Truth is not something to hold but to be.

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3. "Revealing dimensionless perpetuity"
